Mitchell for County Supervisor 2020 may accept up to \$1,500 per donor for the primary election from individuals, businesses, labor organizations and PACs. Spouses and domestic partners may contribute up to \$3,000 from a joint account, if both donors sign the check. Contributions must be made from the donor's own funds and may not be reimbursed by any other person. The Committee cannot accept contributions from lobbyists and lobbying firms registered with the County of Los Angeles. Contributions from foreign entities and foreign nationals who lack permanent residence in the United States are prohibited. The bundling of contributions is also prohibited including making a contribution through an intermediary.
